#### **Schoenstatt Golden Anniversaries**

This Fall we celebrate 50 years since the 4<sup>th</sup> Milestone of our Schoenstatt History took place. What gratitude fills our hearts for all Our MTA has given us!

First: On **September 13, 1965**, Father Kentenich received a telegram calling him back to Rome. Although he asked for a written confirmation, none was received. At the farewell in the Exile Shrine, he spoke of his three wishes: "Child, do not forget your Mother; do not forget the mercies of the Eternal Father God, and do not forget your misery." On September 16, he left Milwaukee via a day in New York. Let us never forget to take the hand of our MTA, and utilize our miseries in order to grow deeper into the heart of the eternal God.


Second: On October 20 & 22, 1965, Father Kentenich learned that the Holy Office Cardinals and thereafter Pope Paul VI signed the statement that dropped all decrees against him, exactly 14 years later to the day. With great family joy on November 16, 1965, Father Kentenich celebrated his 80<sup>th</sup> Birthday. Bishop Joseph Hoeffner of Muenster formally accepted Father into his diocese. The final session of the Second Vatican Council was concluded on December 8, 1965. On that same afternoon, Father Kentenich carried out the symbolic blessing of the cornerstone for a future shrine in Rome.

Third: On December 22 and 24, 1965, Father Kentenich experienced the 4<sup>th</sup> Milestone of our Schoenstatt History. Pope Paul VI received Father Kentenich in a private audience, thanking him for all he had done for Holy Mother Church. Our founder replied: "In the name of the Schoenstatt Family, I heartily thank you for the good works you have lavished on Schoenstatt to an extraordinary degree, but also for my personal rehabilitation. In gratitude for everything which Your Holiness has done, we want to diligently work to help realize the unique mission of the post-conciliar Church for our modern times. And all of this under the patronage of the Mother of the Church." Then exactly on the Holy Eve, Father Kentenich flew to Frankfurt and could celebrate at midnight, the first of three holy Masses in the Original Shrine after 14 years of testing.

Indeed, Mother Took Perfect Care! This second miracle of the Holy Night brings us to see our USA Mission to live the new father, new child, and new community image. We beg our MTA for an unflinching confidence in God and his wise plan despite any opposition. May Schoenstatt be the very heart of the Church through each one of us living the covenant of love. We want to rise up to the stars, up to heaven, to the heart of God...

Let us hence forth entrust this Year to the Mother of Mercy, that she turn her gaze upon us and watch over our journey: our penitential journey, our year-long journey with an open heart, to receive the indulgence of God, to receive the mercy of God."
