WE BEGIN TOGETHER THE NEXT SCHOENSTATT CENTURY

These four examples highlight the Schoenstatt quest for personal ideal and special resolution. Who am I and what is my specific mission statement? Why did God create me out of an ecstasy of love at this particular time and place and need...?

Pope Francis decided to celebrate his 78th birthday with a gesture of love and solidarity with the poorest of Rome. The Argentinean Pontiff had 400 sleeping bags distributed among the homeless of the city to help them cope with the harsh Roman winter's temperatures. The media was told only the next day.

Fifty years ago, Father Kentenich was called back to Rome from a time of testing by the Church. As he stood at the podium, surrounded by his Schoenstatt Family from all walks of life, he said: "I know how eagerly you must be waiting for my first words to you on this solemn occasion after fourteen years. There are two possibilities. I could stay with you on earth; or I could climb up to heaven with you. I do not want to remain on earth. I want to rise up with you, up to the stars, up to heaven." For our founder this meant "to contemplate the heart of God, to try to discover God's plans, to apply them to our own lives, so that, instructed by what we discover, we can see more clearly into the future."

A young couple desiring more communication in their marriage, despite early work schedules and little ones to care for, decided to write a daily post-it-note to be left at the breakfast nook jotting down one of the ways they cared about each other in the last 24 hours.

A student sensed there was challenge ahead. To put it in better perspective, not to let the injustice of the moment swallow up the nonreturnable time of new frontiers of learning, a prayer for professors was composed and prayed when needed.

"What is the personal ideal? ... It is the unique and original image of each one of us and our personal mission in life that God has known from eternity. He placed this unique and individual image in our natural and supernatural character ... he placed it inside of us. The personal ideal is an original and completely individual way to live out the life of Jesus." J.K. 1951

"My personal ideal is the divinely-inspired mentality of my soul. In other words, it is divinely-inspired motivations and tendencies ... If I am faithful to this ideal, it will lead me to the freedom of God's children." This was spoken by Father Kentenich in 1927. His whole life was spent in helping people discover their dynamic, living personality and mission in order to be motivated and equipped to live this life to the fullest.

January is a good month, at the beginning of the year to take stock, set goals, make a plan. Schoenstatters work to actualize their personal ideals via the special resolution and spiritual daily charting. The main point to conquer, the starting point, the concrete, to-the-point, do-able daily action that will help me change my behavior and attitude to the best, is termed the special resolution. A nightly checking off this main point along with a few other areas of improvement-based actions, thoughts, or prayers is called the spiritual daily order. This gives a great assessment for monthly confession. Add some spiritual retreat time, meetings with an interested group near you, and holiness is in the making!

Since 2006, the Girls Youth have counted their contributions to the capital of grace on slips of paper. As a closing to the Centennial Year the girls from three states burnt the offering.






JULY & SEPTEMBER CONFERENCES

Fifty years after Fr Kentenich left Milwaukee on September 16, 1965, for Rome, we come together as Schoenstatt Family to explore the ways in which God guided our founder and his Schoenstatt Family towards greater love for the Church and deeper surrender to the will of God. This will also be the 50th jubilee celebration of the founding of the Schoenstatt Fathers on July 15, 1965, at the International Shrine of the Father Kingdom.
