

FATHER EYE SYMBOL

This October we expect "a precious visit" by Father Joseph Kentenich in the symbol of the Father Eye to our Midwest families and groups. We are slated for October 3 to 21, 2013. This symbol represents the essence of fatherhood and is designed for the Original Shrine on its Centennial Feast of October 18, 2014. In hope that more families (with their relatives and friends), will partake of the grace to pray with this father eye symbol, we are offering not only the traditional 3rd Sunday in October but the Three first Sundays in October to come to a Founding Day Celebration in your area! With our Mother Thrice Admirable, Queen, and Victress of Schoenstatt we are approaching the **50th Anniversary of the HOME SHRINE**. This was



proclaimed by our founder, Father Joseph Kentenich, at the Movement House in Milwaukee, WI, on November 18. 1963. Father Kentenich had waited and observed, prayed and pondered since October of 1962 when the idea of creating a mini-shrine right on the living room wall of their home had been suggested by some of the mothers of the couples who had been meeting with Father (every Monday evening) since the mid-1950s. He proclaimed: "Everything that applies to the Original Shrine and daughter shrines holds true also for the home shrines... What is promised in regard

to the home shrine, to every home shrine? What is requested? The six promises and the six requests of the Founding Document." Fr. Kentenich was convinced that the MTA would like to accomplish the same for the family from their home shrine as from the Original Shrine and the over 210 daughter shrines worldwide. We want to live the covenant of love and bring daily contributions to Our Lady's treasury of grace. Our past year's motto impelled us: Your Home Shrine – Our Mission, Live It!

And last, but not least, we open the SCHOENSTATT CENTENNIAL YEAR during our Founding Sundays. We rejoice, remember, and give thanks for all that God has given our world since October 18, 1914, in the Covenant of Love with our MTA.

Monthly Group Meetings Offer

In preparation for the great Schoenstatt Centennial the adult couples and mothers groups are offered a fully prepared Schoenstatt Covenant of Love DVD series w/manuals. Since we want to make or to renew our covenant with the MTA at the Jubilee Family Shrine on October 18, 2014, this is seen as a very do-able preparation which will also bring lay leadership forth. Fatherhood in Father Eye Symbol

This October, exactly 65 years later, Schoenstatt's founder, Father Joseph Kentenich will once again visit the Midwest. How is this possible? We like to think of it this way: Schoenstatt members want to welcome our father and founder into their home shrines, into their group meetings, into their parish functions, into their striving for holiness, into their hearts and lifestyles in the Symbol of the Father Eye. This precious sign, which is designed for the Original Shrine on October 18, 2014, will be the crowning touch at the grand event of the 100th Birthday Celebration of the Covenant of Love with the MTA at Schoenstatt's Founding in Germany.

And we here around the Jubilee Family Shrine, are privileged to experience this historic event at the celebration of the Golden Jubilee of the Home Shrine, as well as the Opening Festivities of the Schoenstatt Centennial! Father Kentenich liked that phrase: The dumbest farmers grow the biggest potatoes.


The Father Eye Symbol was a gift which Father Kentenich received in person; then so characteristic of him, he gave it on and entrusted this "international" Father Eye Symbol destined for the Original Shrine to the Schoenstatt Leaders of the Diocese of Trier. Father asked them to take care that one day it could be placed above the "original" MTA picture. The first world tour began during the 1968 October Week beginning in Argentina, coming to the USA in Spring of 1969.

In anticipation of the Schoenstatt Centennial, once again the idea was born to allow the father eye symbol to travel throughout the world, drawing hearts "Homeward to the Father goes our way..." This is also a perfect opportunity to renew our prayers and sacrifices for the beatification process of Father Kentenich to advance from the Trier home diocese to Rome. We also want to include the many intentions we carry in our hearts during this Year of Faith within the widest Catholic circles and our Year of Mission for our Schoenstatt circles.

Let this father eye symbol speak to you. It is a symbol for the reality that our founder was chosen and educated by the Blessed Mother to be a genuine transparency of God, the Eternal Father, for our time. It is a symbol for the reality that all who meet our father and founder in the shrine network in faith and confidence, will also become aware of his spiritual presence and blessed activity among his spiritual children. Father Kentenich is a friend, guide, and counselor for you and for each and every one of your intentions and worries, needs and successes...

Meditate on this passage and make plans to attend one of our three October Founding Sundays near you.

"We need only recall that these days people flee from God in a strange way. We have already dared to say that human society is a society of deicides (Friedrich Nietzche: God is dead. God remains dead. And we have killed him.) And what about God? He increasingly withdraws, he can no longer be understood because he allows so much cross and suffering to come upon us. That is why we are longing to re-establish our picture of God within ourselves, in particular the picture of God as the Father... You feel how much we need not just a picture of God that we can hold onto firmly, not just a picture of a justly loving God the Father, but a picture of the merciful Father... Unless we keep before our mind's eye the picture of God the Father as the merciful father, and unless our picture of the child also changes, for example, to the picture of the weak, helpless child of the Father, we will all begin to flee from God as time goes on, because we will no longer be able to cope with So, not only the Father wills our covenant of love with the Mother of God to flow into a covenant of love with the Father.
