WE ARE ON THE LAST 100 DAYS TO OUR MTA'S SCHOENSTATT CENTENNIAL

My Queen, My Mother, I give myself entirely to you and to show my devotion to you, I consecrate to you this day, my eyes, my ears, my mouth, my heart, my entire self without reserve. As I am your own, my good Mother, guard me and defend me as your property and possession. Amen.

When Father Kentenich penned: "The original covenant of love between the Mother Thrice Admirable and Queen of Schoenstatt and Schoenstatt comprises an astonishing abundance of grace and life which cannot be exhausted so quickly," we know we are in for a powerful centennial!

For Schoenstatt's founder and each member, we experience the covenant of love we made with the MTA in line with the biblical covenant history. Let's meditate again on a sentence Fr Kentenich wrote to Msgr Joseph Schmitz: "We may view our covenant ... within the large context of the universal saving event so that, by contrasting or working out the similarity and the dissimilarity, the likeness and the difference, we will gain a better understanding and become convinced that our covenant of love is an original, concrete form of the covenant which God made with humanity in Paradise and wants to actualize through salvation history and world history."

As Schoenstatt members we realize what the Heavenly Father set into motion with the various biblical covenants, he continues through the Blessed Mother in Schoenstatt's covenant of love. This covenant will remain, and we are an integral part of it!

(A SPECIAL JUNE PILGRIMAGE ISSUE IS IN THE MAKING)

One hundred years ago, the word covenant was not used (that came first in 1943 in Dachau), but our founding event traces back to God's initiative. It was not human thinking which arrived at October 18, 1914, but God's guidance. Speaking of a divine intervention in history, Father Kentenich saw the proof in the "creative resultant;" that is, something that developed from small beginnings. His belief and conviction that through the Blessed Mother the Triune God personally became active and intervened in our history is a fundamental and vital reality for Schoenstatt. "Let me point out that the essence of the original covenant of love consists in the belief and conviction that the Blessed Mother made a covenant of love with Schoenstatt as a place and with the whole Schoenstatt community," Father explained to the women's league in 1946.

However, this mutual, eternal covenant initiative from the loving God has six requests and six promises which slowly came into fuller view. We give on how the MTA took up the wish to make this small chapel a place of pilgrimage. Yes, she promised to make the shrine her dwelling place and distribute gifts and graces. However, at the same time she expected self-sanctification from the charter sodalists (and all of us a century later!). Without their willingness to educate themselves, Mary would not make the shrine her dwelling place. The Mother Thrice Admirable's readiness to dispense her graces from the shrine and the sodalists'/our readiness to offer contributions to the capital of grace are always interconnected in the covenant of love.

Let us joyfully CELEBRATE 100 years of covenant loyalty by our MTA and invite 100 new families and friends to make this next century yet more grace filled!
